Double Enrollment: DU PSME + M1 national (1st year of graduate studies in the French national Master diploma)

Background: Beginning in September 2017 the procedure of enrollment and application at the graduate level changed in France. Before this time, every student re-applied between the M1 and M2. All M2s were selective and based on an application no matter where you came from with the level M1.

Starting in September 2017: “No more selection between M1 and M2”. The national reform for higher education in France introduced the selection between undergraduate studies and the M1 and with that did away with the selection (in some way) between the M1 and M2. All students enrolled in one of the national M1 programs has the opportunity via the “Voeux” (Wish) system to rank the M2 programs in the same field as their national M1 program based on their preference. The Voeux procedure takes place via the ENT in your student account. Students are “guaranteed” a spot in an M2 program in their field.

Ex. You are enrolled in the M1 Development Economics. When it is time to make your choice in spring semester for the following year, you must rank 1-2 the 2 options for M2 programs offered in Development Economics.

1. Development Economics (research oriented)
2. Economics of Sustainable Development (Economie du développement durable – indifférencié) (indifferentiated between research or professional)

You will receive one and only one offer for a place in one of the M2 programs in your field. Any enrollment offer is of course pending your successful completion of the M1 (DU PSME in the case of PSME students). You may receive for example your 2nd choice, Economics of Sustainable Development. You can choose to accept it or not but you will not be given another choice.

To **apply** for a spot in **any other M2 field** you should apply via [ecandidat](#) to the programs of your choice during the spring semester of PSME or your M1.

As a PSME student – you do not have automatic enrollment and must therefore apply via [ecandidat](#) for all programs during the spring semester (April/May) UNLESS you take

advantage of the offer to complete a double enrollment at the time of administrative enrollment in September in the PSME + one of the M1 national programs based on agreements made with the program directors.

“Secure” your spot in an M2 with a double enrollment: If you wish to take advantage of the double enrollment offer and “secure” a spot in one of the M2 programs you will need to choose at the time of application and complete the steps during official enrollment in the PSME procedure to get your student card, the M1 field you wish to enroll in for a double enrollment. You will not have to take additional coursework, just the appropriate coursework in the specific [PSME track](#) designed for this purpose. This double enrollment means that the DU PSME is accepted as an equivalent to the national M1 program (ex. Equivalent to the national M1 Economie du développement (M1B403) or M1 Economie Internationale (M1B40B) or M1 MBFA (M1B408)). This way you benefit from exactly the same access to the M2 programs as students enrolled in the national M1. If you wish to complete an M2 in another field where we do not have an agreement for the M1 double enrollment (ex. APE) you can apply as any regular student via ecandidat in the Spring.

To secure your spot and take advantage of the double enrollment offer **you will have to enter your chosen field on your application file. Information on all Master programs available online [here](#).**

You will be responsible for the cost of the secondary enrollment in one of the national M1 programs. The fee is set by the French government in July before enrollment in September. The fee is generally around 250 euros. This fee is required to be paid on top of the regular PSME tuition fee of 6500 euros.
